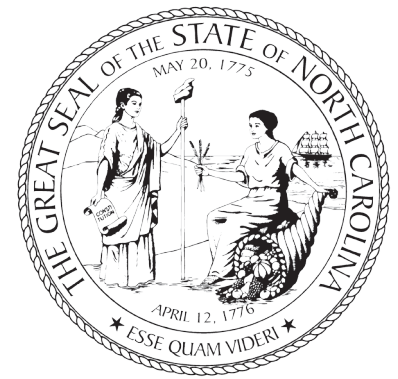

Message from the Board Chair, Nancy Harrell, LMBT

I want to begin this message by saying, “Thank you.” Thank you to Board staff who do an excellent job of handling the day-to-day operations of the Board and keeping the Board members informed and organized. Another big “Thank you” also goes out to my fellow Board members for their dedication to the work of the Board.

And what is that work you may ask? I’m so glad you asked!

North Carolina General Statute 90-621, declares that the purpose of the North Carolina Massage and Bodywork Therapy Practice Act (Practice Act) is to “ensure the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this State receiving massage and bodywork therapy services.” The Practice Act then continues on in 90-626 to create the North Carolina Board of Massage and Bodywork Therapy with power and duties “granted for the purpose of enabling the Board to safeguard the public health, safety, and welfare against unqualified or incompetence practitioners.”

If you have ever attended one of our meetings, you have seen your Board in action, doing exactly what these powers and duties allow us to do; evaluate the qualifications of applicants for licensure, regulate and approve massage and bodywork therapy schools, conduct administrative hearings and investigations to determine violations of the Practice Act, issue, renew, deny, suspend, and revoke licenses or otherwise discipline licensees when necessary. The members of your Board take these duties very seriously. Every single one of us dedicates our time to make sure that the practice massage and bodywork therapy in North Carolina is safe and that individuals seeking massage and bodywork therapy services can be assured that their licensed therapist is upholding the requirements and standards of a licensee in this State.

As we look to 2026, I am confident that it will be another busy and productive year for the North Carolina Board of Massage and Bodywork Therapy. I would also like to invite you to come see what we do for yourselves. Our meetings take place six times a year, in Raleigh, and are open to the general public. We look forward to seeing you.

Top Reminders

1. Keep the Board informed of any changes to your mailing address and email address so you will receive all Board correspondence.
2. All Board meetings are open to the public and are held every other month. The current meeting schedule is on the website under ‘Board Information’.
3. Complaints can be filed online at the File A Complaint tab on the Board’s website.
4. The online renewal is on the Board’s website under the Renew Your License tab. Online renewals end on December 31 at midnight. Renewals after December 31 must include a \$75 late fee and be mailed with a letter stating whether or not you have been practicing massage and bodywork therapy in NC since your license expired.
5. The late renewal fee was removed for renewals submitted after November 1 and on or before December 31.
6. LMBTs must complete 24 hours of continuing education, including a minimum of 3 hours of ethics. A minimum of 12 hours must be completed in-classroom. Live webinars are not considered in-classroom. A maximum of 8 hours of business management may be completed, should you choose to do so.
7. LMBTs can enter their CE into the online system anytime throughout the year by going to the Therapist tab and click on Renew Your License and Continuing Education Requirements. If you have issues uploading your documentation, contact the Board office.
8. LMBTs and establishment owners can verify a license is valid in NC on the Board’s website under the Verify A License tab and searching by their last name or license number.
9. LMBTs and establishment owners are required to notify the Board if they know a person is: (1) practicing without a license, (2) violating the Practice Act/Rules and Regulations, (3) charged with certain criminal offenses, or (4) a defendant in a civil lawsuit related to the practice of massage and bodywork therapy.
10. LMBTs are required to display their Board-issued original license at their primary place of practice. Licensees providing massage and bodywork therapy outside of their primary place of practice must have a Board-issued original license or wallet card available for inspection. A new licensee must receive their original license prior to practicing in NC.
11. Establishment owners are required to display their Board-issued original license and licenses of all LMBTs to be visible by the public. All persons who provide massage and bodywork therapy services at an establishment shall be currently licensed by the Board.
12. Each LMBT shall work at a location that has an establishment license or at a location that is exempt from the establishment licensing requirement.
13. Information regarding establishment licensure is provided on the Board’s website under the Establishment tab.

Their terms began on August 1, 2025 and will end June 30, 2028.

Tawanda Carpenter, Ed.D.:

Brian Keogh, MD:

Dr. Brian H. Keogh, Jr. is a board-certified physician in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (PM&R) with subspecialty board certification in Interventional Pain Medicine. He currently practices with ECPC Pain Specialists in Wake County, where he specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic pain conditions through comprehensive, multidisciplinary, and interventional approaches.

Originally from Colorado, Dr. Keogh earned his medical degree from the University of Colorado School of Medicine. He completed his residency training in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Indiana University School of Medicine, serving as Chief Resident during his final year, and subsequently completed fellowship training in Interventional Pain Medicine at Emory University School of Medicine.

Throughout his career, Dr. Keogh has worked closely with physical therapists, massage therapists, and other healthcare professionals to help patients improve function, reduce pain, and enhance quality of life. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE BOARD FROM JANUARY 1, 2025 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2025

The Board is authorized to investigate complaints and institute disciplinary actions, as set forth in Section .0900 of the Rules.

CONDITIONAL LICENSES:

The License Standards Committee of the Board issued twelve (12) Conditional Licenses to persons whose applications showed evidence of past minor criminal behavior, possibility of practicing without a license, education deficiency or other minor improper conduct.

DENIAL OF LICENSE:

The Board denied licenses to fifteen (15) applicants. Two (2) applicants were denied a license because the curriculum of the massage school they attended did not meet the Board's minimum requirements: Rachel Gao and Christine Poole. Four (4) applicants were denied a license due to lack of moral character and/or not meeting the standards to be licensed as a LMBT: Kellie Alphin, Qiuying Liang, Farantino Roberts and Hong Song. One (1) applicant was denied due to not appearing for an interview: Yunjue Guo. Eight (8) applicant was denied for proficiency in English: Ting Bo, Jun Cao, RongRong Cao, Maricela Duque, Bing Li, Wenyu Ma, Eun Park and Caiping Xiang.

NOTICE OF POTENTIAL VIOLATION:

There were sixteen (16) Notices served on persons for allegedly practicing without a license or aiding and abetting unlicensed practice and twenty-eight (28) Notices served on businesses upon information they were allowing a person to practice massage and bodywork therapy without a North Carolina license.

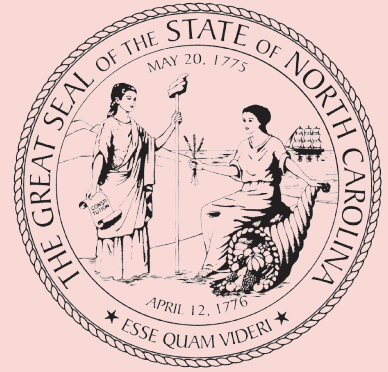
